Whereas The Military Order of the World Wars was founded in 1919 by Officers who served under General of the Armies John Joseph Pershing to perpetuate the ideals of patriotism, the promotion of National Security, the fostering of fraternal relations among all branches of the Armed Forces of the United States, and the defense of the honor, integrity, and supremacy of our National government and the Constitution of the United States, and,

Whereas The National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution was founded in 1889 to honor patriot ancestors and perpetuate the ideals of liberty and our constitutional republic and hold commemorations honoring events that occurred during the American Revolution, and,

Whereas both organizations inculcate and stimulate love of our Country and the Flag, and promote and further patriotic education in our Nation, and honor law enforcement operations, and defend the honor and integrity and supremacy of our National Government and the Constitution of the United States, and,

Whereas there exists a mutual desire to protect the true history of our great Nation, and to perform ceremonies to honor historical events, and a dedication to support youth activities such as Junior and Senior ROTC, and Boy and Girl Scout programs, and youth leadership activities;

Therefore Be It Resolved that The Military Order of the World Wars and The National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution pledge to support this Resolution of Cooperation in order to promote and expand participation and involvement in mutually beneficial programs throughout the Nation for a better America.
